

- 6. To give the children and families an experience of the Church as community.
- 7. To deepen prayer life of the children and families.
- 8. To motivate the children and families to live life rooted in charity and social justice based on the moral teachings of the church.
- 9. To expose the students and families to the liturgical and sacramental richness that is part of Catholic tradition.

RCIA adapted for Children for grades 4-6 in the Fine Arts Room located in the Preschool Building.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd for ages 3-5 in the atrium located in the Preschool building sessions times are 11:00 a.m. -12:15 p.m.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd ages 6-9 sessions meet in the atrium located in the Preschool Building. Times are 5:00 - 6:00 p.m. and 6:30 - 7:30 p.m.

Bible Club for 4th – 6th Grade sessions meet in the Fine Arts Room located in the Preschool Building. Time is 6:30 - 7:30 p.m.

Tuesday:

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd ages 6-9, sessions meet in the atrium located in the Preschool Building. Time is 4:00 - 5:00 p.m.

Wednesday:

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd ages 3-5, sessions meet in the atrium located in the Preschool Building. Time is 10:00 -11:15 a.m.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd ages 3-5, sessions meet in the atrium located in the Preschool Building. Times are 1:30 - 2:45 p.m.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd ages 6-9, sessions meet in the atrium located in the Preschool Building. Time is 4:00 - 5:00 p.m.

Sacramental Preparation Sessions

First Reconciliation(confession) Prep are six (3) sessions

Time: 4:00 p.m.-5:00 p.m.

Place: Fine Arts Room located in the preschool building.

Each month's activities will include a teaching on a virtue, saint, craft and regular Service Projects

Expectations

From Parents:

- 1. Attend Mass regularly as a family.
- 2. Ensure that your children attend sessions regularly and on time
- 3. <u>All children must be signed in and out each session time</u> (person signing out must be listed on the Emergency card and at least 16 years old).
- 4. Communicate any special needs or circumstances that may affect their child within the classroom.
- 5. Be an active part of your child's faith learning and be involved.
- 6. Notify the Coordinator of Faith Formation if your child will be absent by email: pam@olmctempe.com or 480-344-5226.

From the Students:

- 1. Attend class regularly.
- 2. Behave in a Christian manner at all times showing respect and being cooperative with adults and other children.
- 3. Actively participate in classroom discussions and activities.

From the Catechists:

- 1. Welcoming and helpful to all faith formation families.
- 2. Provide a Safe and Christian atmosphere within the learning environment so that children will be able to grow in their faith.
- 3. Prepare and teach designated curriculum.
- 4. Be a positive Christian role model.
- 5. Communicate regularly with and involve parents in the faith development of their children.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd uses prepared weekly presentations that cover the Liturgy, Liturgical Seasons of the church, Parables, History of the Salvation of God, and Morality that are presented by a trained Catechist.



Location of Sessions

<u>Catechesis of the Good Shepherd</u> is the Atrium located in the Preschool Building.

RCIA adapted for Children is in the Fine Arts Room located in the Preschool Building.

4- 6 Bible Club is in the Fine Arts Room located in the Preschool Building.



Sacramental Preparation

This is an especially sacred time in a family's life as well within the parish. Children in second grade celebrate **First Reconciliation** (Confession). Children in grades third celebrate **Confirmation and First Eucharist** (Communion). Our Sacramental process is in partnership between the church and family. First Confession Prep, the catechists discuss and teach the sacrament of penance (confession).

Confirmation and Eucharist Prep (communion) help further familiarize your children in the church, Mass and the church teachings on these two sacraments. Home activities materials will be provided. In addition parents need to attend all sessions with their child and attend Mass with your child on a regular basis, complete any home assignments with your child and attend the family retreats.

A copy of baptismal certificate is to be turned in to the faith Formation coordinator \underline{at} the time of registration.

RCIA for Children

The Christian Initiation of Children helps families prepare their child $4th - 6^{th}$ grade for sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, and or Confirmation and First Communion.

Children's Stewardship

Children's Ministry:

Monthly Children's Mass: The First Sunday of each month at the 9:00 a.m. Mass Need Lectors, Greeters/Ushers, Gift Bearers and children that enjoy singing for the Children's Choir.

Newsletter


