

INSTRUCTIONS ON THE RECEPTION OF THE PRECIOUS BLOOD

On Sunday, September 15th, the Distribution of the Precious Blood will be reintroduced at masses in a phased rollout, beginning at the 9am and 11am masses. As discussed in previous articles about the Precious Blood, one does not need to consume both species of the Blessed Sacrament (Body and Blood separately) to receive all of Christ; he is completely present in either species. If, however, you wish to receive the Precious Blood, please follow the instructions below.

The Precious Blood will be distributed at two locations in the church: one for each half of the church, split down the center aisle. If you are receiving the Precious Body from either the center aisle where the Priest is distributing Holy Communion, or if you are receiving from the side aisle where a lay person Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion is assisting with the distribution, you can receive the Precious Blood at a small table with a white tablecloth in between each of those aisles where an Extraordinary Minister will be standing and distributing the Precious Blood.

Approach this table and stand in front of it, not to the side of the table, so you are directly facing the Extraordinary Minister. If there is another person already at the table, please form a line to each side of the table along the curve of the white stone Sanctuary floor, until it is your turn to receive the Precious Blood.

middle of the front of the table, the Extraordinary Minister will raise the chalice and say, "The Blood of Christ." You in turn respond, "Amen." After saying Amen, they will hand the chalice to you. When being handed the chalice, please always hold it with two hands: one hand underneath it, holding the base, and the other hand

Once it is your turn to receive, and you are directly in the

- near the top rim. The Extraordinary Minister will be holding the chalice in the middle by the stem.
- The Precious Blood contained within the chalice is Jesus himself, so we want to ensure not even the smallest droplet of His blood falls. Please be very careful when handling the chalice.
- After taking hold of the chalice, take a small sip of the Precious Blood. This is not a "drink" from the chalice like you would take with a normal beverage. This is just a ritual sip, enough just to taste.
- After taking a sip, carefully hand the chalice back, ensuring you do not let go until the Extraordinary Minister has taken hold of the chalice.
- Then, turn around 180 degrees and walk back to your pew via the aisle directly in line with the chalice table.

8 SEP 2024 A NOTE FROM FATHER

THE MOST DEADLY POISON OF OUR TIME IS INDIFFERENCE

Dear Friends,

This is a famous quote from one of the Church's great modern saints, Maximilian Kolbe; a Franciscan priest who lived his life leading others to Christ and gave his life at Auschwitz in order to save the life of another. We recently celebrated the feast of Saint Maximilian Kolbe and his call to recognize the poison of indifference is even more relevant today. As connected and informed as we are, we live in a culture of inaction, complacency, and comfort. We fluff up a pillow and hunker down while pointing out what is wrong with the world and its inhabitants. I do not mean this as a generalization, but more as the cultural symptom that Saint Maximilian Kolbe identifies as indifference. It is easier now than ever before to carve out a space of complacency and comfort and recognize the problems, but never commit to help solve them.

There are, of course, many things that we cannot change. Violence, war, bigotry, poverty among other issues are universal problems that plague our fallen world. We can look at the big issues and become discouraged. We move into doom and despair before we even have a chance to respond to the inspiration of the Holy Spirit who calls us into action. We recognize in faith that we are called to follow the Lord as disciples, and with this we are tasked with proclaiming the gospel, the good news of Our Lord's passion, death, and resurrection. This takes many forms in word and action, and each and every one of us is called uniquely to devote our efforts towards building up the Kingdom of God on earth. However, in order to effect change and proclaim the gospel, we must commit ourselves to giving of our time.

It is so easy to procrastinate, to wait for the perfect time to do something. I know because I am a serial procrastinator and a perfectionist. It is a common temptation for me to wait for the right time or for something to be easier. The truth is; however, the perfect time will never come. Things will never get less "busy," and life will never slow down. Again, we are uniquely called into discipleship, and to proclaim the gospel, but we need to commit ourselves to actually doing it. This means being good stewards of our time. This means sacrificing time we might use in other ways to make of ourselves a gift to others and to the world for the sake of the kingdom.

We can always justify that we do not have time or that someone else will do it, but we also recognize that our time on this earth is not forever. Through discernment of the Holy Spirit and in recognizing the needs of our community and the ways in which we can affect the world, we hear the call to discipleship and an invitation to commit our time and energy to the mission of the Church.

We hear from Paul on this matter in the letter to the Ephesians as he says:

Watch carefully then how you live, not as foolish persons but as wise, making the most of the opportunity, because the days are evil. Therefore, do not continue in ignorance, but try to understand what is the will of the Lord. And do not get drunk on wine, in which lies debauchery, but be filled with the Spirit, addressing one another [in] psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and playing to the Lord in your hearts, giving thanks always and for everything in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to God the Father.

Ephesians 5: 15-20

Paul warns us against procrastination and spiritual indifference and encourages us to live each day as a gift by making use of our talents and our time in order to better serve in the Church and live a life of holiness; not tomorrow, but here and now. Therefore, I encourage us to respond to the call to action and commitment in being good stewards of our time, both in making more time for the Lord in our lives through prayer and the sacraments, but also in committing ourselves to being involved in our parish community beyond Sunday mass attendance. In doing so we are challenged to not give in to what we might spiritual procrastination or indifference, and instead actively engage with the living mission of Christ's bride the Church, here and now.
